His Life

- Enters the Franciscan order at age 22
- Becomes friends with Thomas Aquinas
- Receive their Doctorate degrees, allowing Aquinas to receive his first
- Chosen to be the General of his order at age 35
- Composed a book, The Life of Saint Francis
- Appointed the Cardinal and Bishop of Albano
- Helped to unite the Greek and Latin Churches
- Died under suspicious circumstances
- Canonized in 1482
- Declared a Doctor of the Church by Pope Sixtus V
